Appendix 4C Quarterly Cash Flow Report for the Quarter Ending 31 March 2020

Farmaforce Limited ("Farmaforce" or "Company") (ASX:FFC), a contract sales organization offering innovative solutions to the Australian Pharmaceutical Industry, is pleased to release its Quarterly Activity Report and associated Appendix 4C (Quarterly Cashflow Report) to the market.

Business Activities for the Quarter

The key highlights are:

- External revenue increased by 38% for Q3 FY20 when compared to Q3 FY19 (FY20: \$3,866k; FY19: \$2,800k);
- Cost of Sales increased by 24% for Q3 FY20 when compared to Q3 FY19 (FY20: \$3,232k; FY19: \$2,603k);
- Gross Margin was 16% for the current quarter compared to 7% (Q3 FY19);
- An increase of 12% in receipts from customers for Q3 FY20 when compared to Q3 FY19 (FY20 \$3,884k; FY19 \$3,459k);
- An increase of 38% in operating net cash inflows for Q3 FY20. This is an increase of \$174K compared to Q3 FY19 (FY20: \$628k; FY19: \$454k);
- The significant increase in the net operating cashflow in Q3 FY20, is largely driven by strong receipt collectability from existing clients and additional receipts off the back of securing new client contracts;
- During the quarter, the Company repaid \$624k of borrowings.

Farmaforce has focused on increasing sales capacity, innovating its business model from fee for service to a profit sharing partnering model with its clients, and diversifying its sales reach across more medical specialties.

During the quarter, the Company was able to secure new contracts and clients which has built a solid backlog and increased cashflow vs this time last year, the full impact being realized in the current and subsequent quarters.

The Company successfully launched an additional Pharmaceutical sales team which significantly extended services beyond the GP sales, which has been the company's primary focus during the past 2 years. The sales force team utilization is at near full capacity which contributes significantly to the revenue and gross margin increase.

In line with the investor update on the 10th March 2020, the Company is anticipating an aggressive revenue increase of 45.5% vs 2H19. The FY20 revenue outlook is projected to come in at a growth rate of 22.2% vs FY19, based on contracts booked to date.

Gross margins are expected to a robust 21.6% for 2H FY20 vs 2.8% FY19.

Payments to Related Parties and their Associates (Refer section 6 of Appendix 4C)

During the quarter, the Company paid \$2,231k in relation to overhead reimbursement costs, repayments of the borrowings, consulting fees and directors' remuneration to its related parties and their associates.
