<p><i>On 24 March 2022, the Company extended its loan facility with Mitchell Asset Management Pty Ltd ("MAM", which is secured against future R&amp;D refunds to be received by the Company and its wholly owned subsidiary AtCor Medical Pty Ltd), following a repayment during the quarter using the proceeds of the Company's 2021 R&amp;D Tax Incentive of ~\$480,000. This repayment cleared the outstanding balance owed to MAM, and allowed the Company to negotiate terms for an extension of the facility which in effect provided for a new drawdown by the Company to access a total of \$1,294,125 as a prepayment of forecasted R&amp;D tax incentive claim for the year ended 30 June 2022.</i></p> <p><i>The agreement has a termination date of 31 October 2022 and the Facility attracts interest at 1% per calendar month on the balance of funds drawn. Net cash received from the facility in the quarter was \$1,199,285 with the difference of \$94,840 withheld for establishment costs and prepaid interest.</i></p>

<p>Answer:</p> <p>Yes, although it is noted that operating cash outflows and operating costs generally are closely monitored for improvement.</p>

Answer:

Yes. The Company has taken steps to manage its working capital position by accessing extended terms with MAM for debt funding during the quarter (as disclosed at Item 7.6) and has demonstrated a proven capability to raise further capital on a timely basis from both equity and debt markets if required to fund its operations.

8.6.3 Does the entity expect to be able to continue its operations and to meet its business objectives and, if so, on what basis?

Answer:

Yes the Company has a clear focus on its operations and managing both its current operating business in addition to new business and additional revenue generating product lines. This will be funded through the continuing operation of those businesses and the working capital management and (where required) funding as discussed above at 8.6.2.
